

WONDERSPACE FUTURE is a multimedia theatre performance exploring the theme of life in space. In a fun, exciting, and unexpected way, the show delves into different aspects of life beyond Earth.

In the near future, humanity is reaching for the stars, and the first child born in space, Mira, has become a symbol of hope and technological progress.

Growing up on the learns space station, she is a global phenomenon - an influencer, an experiment, and an icon of the future.

As society elevates her to near-mythical status, Mira begins to question her role. Deprived of true choice, she longs for Earth – a world she has never touched but which calls to her with its mystery. Meanwhile, two lovable alien explorers, Flip and Flop, stumble upon the planet and see it as the perfect place to grow tea.

Blending philosophical reflection, social satire, and science fiction, the play raises profound questions about human identity, isolation, and the price of progress. All of this is infused with sharp humor and fascinating insights. Will Mira embrace the destiny imposed upon her, or will she carve out her own path?

Wonderspace Future is a bold and thought-provoking theatrical adventure that combines humor, deep social critique, and a visionary take on the future of humanity.



In 2008 he founded Famille Mundi theatre company in Paris in which he has worked with artists from more than 20 countries.

Dimitar Uzunov and Famille Mundi twice received the label Young Talent of Paris delivered by Paris Municipality. Their production The Dream (Le Songe) won the Grand Award in Nice in 2010 at the festival of young and student theatre. In 2016 Dimitar co-founded Sofia-based Arte Urbana Collectif. He is also founder and director of Summer Scriptwriting Base, an immersive international summer school for the storytellers of tomorrow. He is the founder of the platform Theatre & Science and more recently coordinator of the European project Please ASK for producing science theatre, linking artists with scientists. Dimitar is a director of Theatre of Wonder – Bulgaria, festival for art and science.

Dimitar Uzunov has authored, directed and acted in many theatre productions in France, USA and Bulgaria. He has been a keynote speaker, lecturer and workshop facilitator on various topics in more than 20 countries around the world.

Andrea Brunello works at the intersection of theater and science. Andrea holds a bachelor's degree in physics and mathematics from Cornell University (USA), a doctorate in physics from Stony Brook University (New York), and a masters degree in science and innovation communication from the University of Trento (Italy).



Nalbantov graduated from the National Academy of Arts in Sofia with a master's degree in Authorial Visual Performance; He won the Icarus Award for set design in 2010 for the production "Four Rooms"; In the same year, he and Evgenia Serbeva won an award at the international eDward - The Young Filmmaker's Award competition for the 3D film "Priceless".

In 2013, he was nominated, together with Elena Shopova, for an Icarus Award for the set design of the visual environment in the project "ProText 5: On Time". His creative biography includes two more nominations for an Icarus Award. Nikola Nalbantov is a set designer and video artist for many theater and dance performances, including "Carnival.com", "Jump", "Madame Mishima" and "Pandora". He is also a set designer and video artist for the productions of Arte Urbana Collective "George Kaplan", "The Long Way to the Stars", "How to Become Einstein in an Hour", "The Synthetic Man – Dream, Nightmare, Reality", "The Exciting World of Maps", and "Wonderspace Future", for which he is also the costume designer.

MOLECULAR BIOLOGIST & ENTREPRENEUR

She is a molecular biologist at the Institute of Molecular Biology at the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences, whose mission is to translate the complex language of science into understandable stories about life. She is an editor and reviewer for a number of international scientific journals, a speaker at prestigious forums such as TED, WEBIT, FORBES, and Bloomberg, and actively promotes science through media appearances and initiatives.

She is the co-founder of EPIX.AI, an innovative startup that uses artificial intelligence and epigenetics for healthier aging. As a science communicator, Milena inspires a wide audience with her ability to connect molecules in cells with people's stories and the meaning of longevity.

Dr Vladimir Bozhilov is an astrophysicist from the Department of Astronomy and Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Physics at Sofia University "St. Kliment Ohridski" and popular science communicator. He was awarded the special "Pythagoras" prize by the Ministry of Education and Science for science communication in 2024, won second place in the science communication competition "FameLab" in 2010, and first prize in its international edition "Hall of FameLab" in 2014. Nikola Gruev - Kottarashky is a musician and composer who combines original recordings with electronic music, hip hop, jazz, and other musical genres. Kottarashky defines his style as "Balkan psychedelic", but critics consider him part of the "Balkan beat wave".

In November 2009, the German label Asphalt Tango Records released Kottarashky's debut album "Opa Hey" which is entirely digital. It was extremely successful, receiving strong reviews in the Western media, remaining among the most sought-after albums for five months and reaching third place in the European World Music chart. The Guardian and The Independent wrote about "Opa Hey".

Stefania holds a bachelor's degree in puppetry from the National Academy for Theatre and Film Arts in Sofia, Bulgaria. She later completed a master's degree in contemporary dance techniques at the Academy of Music, Dance and Fine Arts in Plovdiv, Bulgaria. She is currently a choreographer at the State Theater in Shumen, Bulgaria, and works as a movement director for various theater productions. Stefania made her professional choreographic debut in 2013. Since then, she has created numerous works that have been performed in Bulgaria, Europe, and South Korea.


